Last News of the World Rabbit Congress

Because of COVID pandemic, our 12th World Rabbit Congress is postponed to 23-25 June 2021, Nantes, France). The organising committee has studied several options to organise the congress, to take into account the "impacts" of the COVID pandemic. Obviously, we are dependant of national health regulation. However, the organising committee have decided to propose a **congress using a "hybrid" system**, conjugating "face-to-face" participations AND on-line participations. Details about the concrete organisation will be posted soon on the website of the congress (https://colloque.inrae.fr/wrc2020) and on the WRSA website, and our social network (WRSA Facebook, WRSA google forum).

At present, 185 short papers submitted in 2020 have been accepted, and will presented and published, provided the speaking author will be registered. Still 23 short papers (of 2020) remained under review or correction by author, while 20 papers were withdrawn by the authors.

The second period of submission is closed from 17th January 2021, and 38 "new" papers have been submitted. They are now under reviewing process.

All 8 main speakers, main referees, and chairman of sessions and round table have confirmed their participation for our congress next year. Thus, we are confident about the future success of our 12thWRC.

News from the WRSA branches

During the World Congress of the WRSA in Toulouse, France, in 1996, the members of the North American branch had the idea of organizing a branch of the WRSA that would include North America, Central and South America, as well as the Caribbean countries. The main aim of this branch would be to join the collective interests of rabbit research in America, through the development of a web page, the organization of a congress every four years and the development of an electronic discussion group, among other actions. This organization would be called "The American Branch of the World Scientific Association for Rabbits (AB-WRSA)" and would meet every four years in accordance with the periodic meetings of the WRSA.

The AB-WRSA congresses were held every four years in the cities of Montecillo, (Mexico-1998), Havana (Cuba-2002), Maringá (Brazil-2006), Córdoba (Argentina-2010), Toluca (Mexico-2014) and Goiania (Brazil-2018). The AB-WRSA Bbranch also supports other associations and events, such as those recently organized by Venezuela in 2020 (Congress of women interested on rabbit farming). The next AB-WRSA congress for 2022 is also in planning.

The current Executive Committee of the AB-WRSA is made up of President Yazmín Felipe (Mexico), Vice-President Gaby Quagliariello (Argentina), Secretary/Treasurer Luiz Machado (Brazil) and with logistical support of Kassy Gomes da Silva (Brazil). This board has a WhatsApp group and is in constant contact, exchanging substantial information and holding online meetings.

The greatest difficulties encountered in recent years are involved with the different languages of the continent as well as its great extension. For this reason, the coordination process of rabbit farming in the American continent has had a certain degree of difficulty. However, we strongly believe that the most important thing is to improve the dialogue between researchers and breeders in general, as well as with the different associations of each country. For this reason, towards the end of 2020, we have worked to prepare an online survey, in order to bring the needs of producers closer to researchers to establish research priorities and to generate innovation in the field of American rabbit breeding.

International and National Congresses

In the last six months, WRSA has news about two events held on-line due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

I International Congress of Women of Latin America and the Caribbean interested on Rabbit Farming (Venezuela)

The Rabbit Center for Rural Organization FAGRO-UCV of Venezuela in collaboration with AB-WRSA organized the 1st International Congress of Women from Latin America and the Caribbean Interested in Rabbit Farming on October 16-18, 2020. As a consequence of the pandemic, and in order to reach all interested women from all over America, a new online system accessible to everyone was used, such as the WhatsApp application.

Ten WhatsApp groups were created, where the organization was synchronously uploading the presentations of the invited speakers, slide by slide, each one accompanied by a voice message. In this way, the speakers were able to reach more than 1500 people who followed the congress through their WhatsApp application.





A total of 27 invited speakers from 9 countries participated in the Congress (Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Cuba, Guatemala, Mexico, Spain, Venezuela and Uruguay). Among the speakers participated researchers, technicians, rabbit producers, associations, trainers, furriers, chefs, publicists... The WRSA was present at the congress through the Secretary General (Juan José Pascual) who presented the current state of rabbit farming in the world and in developing countries, and the Vice President of AB-WRSA (Gaby Quagliariello) who presented an experience of rabbit farming development in Mendoza (Argentina).

The presentations were about successful experiences, organizational systems, the role of women and their empowerment through rabbit farming, technical aspects (genetics, reproduction, pathology, nutrition...) and economic management, gastronomy, sustainable production and marketing.

The WRSA has access to all the contents of the congress, which are available to its users.

WebiAsescu (Spain)

As you all know, this year we had to suspend our annual appointment at the Symposium of ASESCU (Spain). However, rabbit production continues, as well as all its challenges, and the sector can only cope with these with the help of knowledge. For this, it is essential to know the opinion of the experts on the issues that concern us, and to know how the research has evolved in the last year. That is why ASESCU launched the **WebiAsescu trilogy**. In each WebiAsescu, of 1h and 30min each, two experts in the field presented the current situation of three current challenges:
