## News from the WRSA branches: ASESCU, Spain

The Spanish Association of Rabbit Farming (ASESCU) was founded in 1976, and currently has 324 active members. ASESCU held at Barcelona its first event in 1976, the "I Symposium on Rabbit Farming" and, since then, it has organized an annual edition without interruption. The next edition will be held in May 2018 at Calamocha (Teruel). In 1980, ASESCU organised the 2<sup>nd</sup> World Rabbit Congress at Barcelona, and in 2000 organised the 7<sup>th</sup> World Rabbit Congress at Valencia. Among the activities carried out by ASESCU can be highlighted an active website (<a href="www.asescu.com">www.asescu.com</a>) with more than 1,100 monthly page visits, a page in Facebook



(https://www.facebook.com/ASESCU-Asociación-Española-de-Cunicultura-252452841464877/) with 650 followers, a Twitter account (@Asescu) with 149 followers and a mailing list. ASESCU publishes the "Boletín de Cunicultura" technical journal since 1978, which is released four times a year. ASESCU organised a discussion meeting on Rabbit farmers' organisations at the 13th International Production Show FIGAN 2017 held at Zaragoza. It also organises training courses for rabbit breeders and technicians. In the last years the association has supported several initiatives aimed at the authorization of drugs for rabbit use and has promoted meetings to reduce the antibiotics use following the EU Joint Action on Antimicrobial Resistance and Healthcare-Associated Infections. In 2017, ASESCU jointly with Pintaluba Laboratories, awarded the 1st Prize for the best communication from a young researcher presented at the Symposium on Rabbit Farming.

Luc Maertens. Finally, we could not close this volume without dedicating a few words to our colleague and friend Luc Maertens, who is still active as Treasurer of the WRSA, but has retired from his job at the Institute for Agricultural and Fisheries Research (ILVO). Along his career, Luc became a senior researcher at the ILVO research center (Belgium) and an expert in rabbit feeding and nutrition. He collaborates to establish the feed recommendations for rabbits, and was the main manager of the European tables of raw material feeding value for the rabbit (published in World Rabbit Science in 2002).



He manages European projects and many national projects on rabbit feeding, and he published several hundreds of publications, and several books. Luc also addressed other reaserch fields (see profile on research gate: <a href="https://www.researchgate.net/profile/Luc Maertens">https://www.researchgate.net/profile/Luc Maertens</a>), such: the feeding and the feed efficiency, the outputs of the rabbit farm (nitrogen, minerals), etc. More recently, Luc developped a research activity on the rabbit housing and welfare. Thus, now, Luc is active in the WRSA working group for rabbit housing. From WRSA, we want to thank you for your wonderful work, which has been key to the development of the rabbit science.
